

Assessor's Policy Will Limit School Building

New policies of the county assessor which will hold any gains in assessed valuation in Torrance to a minimum will make some juggling acts necessary to house new students in Torrance next year.

S. E. Waldrip, assistant superintendent of schools for business, told members of the Torrance Education Advisory Committee the local district will be unable to sell many bonds during fiscal 1964-65 because of an anticipated low increase in valuation.

Bond money is used to build

new schools, but bonding is limited by law to 10 per cent of the total valuation of the district. Waldrip said the limitations will make it difficult to accommodate new students next year.

The TEAC members met for lunch Monday and heard Lyste Albro and Raymond Collins describe some of the vocational programs offered by the Torrance Schools. Albro is work experience coordinator for the district, while Collins is in charge of the adult education program.

The program, presented through color slides and a narration, described the vocational offerings in elementary, high school, and adult education programs.

Betty Harmon, a fashion editor of American Girl Magazine, will be the guest commentator.


SINCE 1915


