

### Testimonial for Hahn Slated Saturday Night

Supervisor Kenneth Hahn will be honored at a testimonial dinner Saturday night at the Serra High School gymnasium, 14830 S. Van Ness Ave.

"We want to show Kenny Hahn just how much the people of his district appreciate what he has done to make this area one of the finest in Los Angeles County," said Lou Lauzon, chairman of the banquet committee.

Carl Hoffman, president of the Harbor District Chambers of Commerce, will be master of ceremonies for the tribute to the veteran supervisor.

THE PROGRAM will include Al Nash, director of Parks and Recreation for Gardena; Father Joseph Hill of St. Anthony's Catholic Church; and Harry R. Fox, brother-in-law of the supervisor.

Special guests for the evening will be Hahn's six brothers and his wife, Ramona.

Jimmy and Janice, the supervisor's children, also will attend.

Entertainment for the evening will be a surprise. It is being planned by Clark Mills, president of the Gardena Chamber of Commerce.

Hahn has represented the second district on the Board of Supervisors since 1952. His district includes 97 square miles of county area and has a population of more than a million persons. The cities of Hawthorne, Inglewood, Gardena, Lawndale, Culver City, Torrance, and parts of Los Angeles are included in the district.

Hahn was the youngest man ever to win a seat on the Board of Supervisors. He is now 43. Prior to his election to the Board of Supervisors, he served four years in the Los Angeles city council.

### Bank to Announce High School Senior Winners

Announcement of the local first-round winners will be made in March for the Bank of America achievement awards program for high school seniors.

For "distinguished achievement and promise of future success and service to society," almost 3,000 Southern California students will receive certificates of achievement; more than 1,000 will be presented engraved trophies, and 372 will receive cash awards ranging from \$25 to \$1,000.

The amount of cash awards will be determined in group oral interviews, with 20 top students from Southern California winning \$1,000 each.

The final selections will be made in May, when the first place winners from the April zone competitions go to Los Angeles to be interviewed by a panel of community leaders.

This will be the 17th year Bank of America has sponsored the achievement awards program, which started in the Los Angeles City schools in 1948 with 50,000 students vying for \$7,000 in cash awards.

The program was expanded statewide in 1951 and this year cash awards will total nearly \$100,000.
