On Feb. 5, I introduced my Assembly Bill No. 43, relating to horse race money for schools. Anyone can obtain two free copies by writing to the Legislative Bill Room, State Capitol, Sacramento 14, Calif. Please ask for "Assembly Bill No. 43 by Chapel, 1964 First Extraordinary Session." You will get very fast service if you send the Legislative Bill Room a stamped, addressed return envelope.

My Assembly Bill No. 43 was referred to the Assembly Committee on Rules which will refer it to another Assembly Committee after the Legislature re-convenes on Monday, March 2. If the bill passes out of the committee which hears the bill, it will come to the floor of the Assembly and then, if 41 members vote for the bill, it goes to the State Senate.

IN THE SENATE, the bill will be heard by at least one committee, and then if passed to the floor of the Senate, if 21 State Senators vote for it, the bill goes to the Governor for signature or veto, as he may decide. This assumes that the bill is not amended in the Senate because if it is amended in the Senate, the bill is returned to the Assembly for concurrence with the Senate Amendments, and then goes to the Governor.

The purpose of my Assembly Bill No. 43 is to obtain money for state financial support of the public schools without levying any new tax or raising any existing tax. If you want a clear understanding of how race-horse money reaches the State now, please write to Louis S. Merrill, general manager, Western Fairs Association, 2500 Stockton Blvd., Sacramento 17 (P. O. Box 5155), and ask for a free copy of his beautiful "Explanation Chart," published December, 1963. The sub-title of the "Explanation Chart" reads:

"Horse Racing Revenue by State of California and Distribution of the Revenue, Fiscal Year July 1, 1962 to June 30, 1963."

WHEN YOU examine the chart you will understand how much horse-race money now goes to fairs, expositions, shows, and similar projects could be made available for public education. The chart shows that for the fiscal year July 1, 1962 to June 30, 1963, \$22,771,159.74 reached the Fair and Exposition Fund. After certain deductions the chart shows that the "First Balance" was \$21,387,948.74; and that the "Second Balance" was \$17,071,048.74. After you carefully study the chart you will see that regardless of how the million dollars are available for public schools if my Assembly Bill No. 43 is enacted into law. However, it is important to remember that the Western Fairs Association probably will oppose my bill violently because my bill is intended to divert money from fairs to public education.

The Digest of my Assembly Bill No. 43, prepared by the Legislative Counsel of the State, is printed on the bill and says:

"REDUCES allocations and appropriations of state horse racing revenues for support of state and local fairs and state supervision of racing activities and diverts them in amounts sufficient to provide additional support for low-wealth public school districts for maintenance of grades kindergarten through 12, inclusive, but only if the board of supervisors of the county in which any such school district is situated has adopted a resolution to expend fair moneys for such school support. Establishes Horse Racing Public School Support Fund in State Treasury, and prescribes procedures for fiscal year apportionment thereof by Superintendent of Public Instruction, and disbursements, to school districts."

Please notice that Assembly Bill No. 43 does not provide any horse-race money for schools in any county unless the board of supervisors of that county adopts a resolution to that effect.

Many fairs, expositions, shows, etc., now receiving horse-race money could continue to operate efficiently without any horse-race subsidy. On the other hand, there are many which would shut down if they lost the horse-race subsidy because there is not now and never has been enough public interest to make them self-supporting. Therefore, one important issue is whether or not any board of county supervisors regards fairs, shows, and expositions more important than public schools.


