"Vocational Guidance for Women," a class to assist women returning to the working field will begin Feb. 26, 10 a.m. to 12 noon, at the Torrance YWCA.

Co-sponsored by the local office of the State Department of Employment, the sessions will delve into the employment field from varied angles.

Included will be: special aptitude testing and individual counseling; speakers from the fields of banking, merchandising, education and industry;

and personnel information on successful job interviews.

The program also will feature representatives from university extension, adult education and colleges to speak on training opportunities in their programs for women.

Representatives from industrial relations departments will discuss methods on obtaining job success and a psychologist will speak on the psychological adjustment necessary in the home when a woman re-enters the labor market.

City Issues \$2 Million In Permits

Building permits valued at nearly \$2 million were issued by the city building department during January, according to reports which were compiled last week.

The permits had an actual value of \$1,977,035, and will provide a total of 104 new dwelling units in the city when construction is completed.

Permits for 83 new apartment units were issued. The four permits had a value of \$776,310. Twenty new single-family homes will be constructed under five permits issued by the city.

Largest of the permits was issued to Howard O. Coale Jr. for a 40-unit apartment at 2421 227th Street. The permit was valued at \$366,420.

Other permits included an office building at 540 Hawaii St., a retail store building at 17512 Hawthorne Ave., and a 15-unit apartment building at 21016 Amie Ave. A total of seven new commercial buildings and three industrial plants will be built under permits issued in January.
