
While there the students will inspect new models of business machines and will speak to sales representatives about the new machines and procedures.

Dalai Lama's Brother Will Lecture at Noon Wednesday

Thubten Norbu, formerly one of the rulers of Tibet and a brother of the Dalai Lama of Tibet, will lecture at Long Beach State College at noon Wednesday.

In his lecture, to be held in Lecture Hall 151, he will explain some of the Tibetan customs, relate the story of pillage by the Red Chinese, and discuss the methods of the Red Chinese in subjecting the mountain kingdom.

Norbu was 17 years old when his brother was selected as the present Dalai Lama. As the eldest brother, Norbu was named the Abbot of Kumbum. He fled from Tibet after being virtually imprisoned in his monastery by the Red Chinese.

Norbu's autobiography, "Tibet Is My Country," has been hailed as a "fabulous story," by world traveler, newscaster, and writer Lowell Thomas.
