### Indonesian Educator Visits El Camino Campus

Augustinus Tangjong, former head of the Bureau of Foreign Relations for the Department of Higher Education of the government of Indonesia, visited El Camino College this week as part of a tour of American community colleges.

"We have no two-year colleges in Indonesia and I, personally, am very interested in the movement for a number of reasons," Tangjong said.

His hosts at El Camino during a two-day visit were Horace Bates, assistant director of instruction and Ted Elmgren, coordinator, technical education.

Tangjong explained his interest in the technical education program as greater than the academic program because he feels technical education is an answer to educational needs in his country.

"WE ARE A developing country. We need training in skilled-worker areas and technical studies in order to maintain and expand our development," he said.

At this time in Indonesia, most education ends at the secondary level. Students who continue their studies must do so in the academic universities. According to Tangjong, there are no provisions for the advanced education of the non-academic or technical student.

For the past two years, Tangjong has been studying educational administration at Teachers College, Columbia. He was awarded his master of arts degree at the end of his studies.

His bachelors degree was earned at Teachers College, Hasanuddin University, Indonesia.

UPON HIS RETURN to Indonesia this month, Tangjong will submit his ideas on two-year higher education to teachers in his country. "I do not know how they will receive my thoughts," he said, "because most advanced-education plans are for large universities."

### Torrance Firm to Install New Pipe Making Facility

Torrance Specialty Fixtures, Inc., has recently been awarded a contract by Kaiser Steel Corp. for new pipe making facilities to be installed in the Fontana plant.

The new pipe plant will produce A.P.I. line pipe from 4 to 16 inches in diameter and will produce these sizes in various wall thicknesses, Charles Babbitt, president of T.S.F., stated.

Torrance Specialty Fixtures, Inc., has been the leader in the field of designing and building pipe plants for light wall high strength pipe production, which pipe has become a major factor in the oil and gas pipeline field in the last few years. The machinery to be supplied to Kaiser Steel by T.S.F. will have incorporated in it all of the latest ideas in pipe mills including the Thermoatool 560 KW High Frequency Resistance Welder.

T.S.F., Inc., was a pioneer in the use of High Frequency welding of A.P.I. line pipe and has built two pipe mills which produce 18-inch to 36-inch pipe continuously. This pipe has the longitudinal welded seam.

THESE PLANTS, one in Calgary, Canada, and one in Monterrey, Mexico, are the largest continuous mills ever built and both have been very successful in operation. The mill in Calgary, Big Inch Pipe Corp., has recently received an order for 150 miles of 30-inch pipe from Westcoast Transmission Co.

Another pipe plant in Canada designed and built by T.S.F., Interprovincial Pipe and Steel Corp. (IPSCO) in Regina, has recently received an order for 22,000 tons of pipe for a liquid hydrocarbon transmission line from Empress, Alberta, to Winnipeg, Manitoba.

IN ADDITION to the Canadian and Mexican plants, T.S.F. has built plants in Israel, France, Belgium, Scotland, Argentina, South Africa, and Italy as well as several in the United States.

The latest mill in the U.S. was supplied to the American Cast Iron Pipe Co. in Birmingham, Ala., which mill has a production capacity from 6-inch to 20-inch in diameter at speeds up to 150 feet per minute.

The new Kaiser mill is scheduled to go into production in the fourth quarter of 1964.
