Holy Week Services Set at St. Andrew's

Good Friday will be observed with the traditional "Watch By the Cross." The three-hour service, beginning at noon, will include a message by Father Percy on the seven words from the cross. Parishioners may re-

main for the entire service, or come and go during the singing of hymns.

Baby sitting will be provided in the nursery for the Good Friday services.

EASTER SUNDAY will be observed with special services, beginning with a Sunrise Holy Communion service at 5:45 a.m. The service will be followed by a fellowship breakfast. Holy Communion will be observed at 7 a.m. Choral Eucharist will be celebrated at the 9 and 11 a.m. services.

Father Percy will deliver his Easter message at the 9 and 11 a.m. services. He will be assisted by the Rev. Robert T. Stellar, executive secretary of the Department of Christian Social Relations of the Episcopal Diocese of Los Angeles.

Baby sitting will be available for the 7, 9, and 11 a.m. services Easter Sunday.

Circulation Increases In Library

Substantial gains were logged in circulation of books by the County Libraries serving the Torrance area during the month of February. A total of 68,954 books were circulated by the eight branch libraries.

Leading all branches in circulation, the downtown Torrance Library reported circulation figures of 14,170 books. The Carson branch was second with 11,587 books taken out during the month.

Other branches were: Isabel Henderson, 10,427; El Retiro, 8,594; North Torrance, 7,196; WALTERIA, 6,427; Lomita, 6,035; and Villa Carson, 2,518.

Total circulation in all Los Angeles County Libraries was 837,557, according to County Librarian William S. Geller.

Juvenile fiction and adult non-fiction led all categories of books in circulation. On the basis of figures for January and February, Geller predicted total circulation of 10 million books for 1964, surpassing all previous years.


