Time for the 1964 Budget session is rapidly running out as I write this. Our Constitution fixes a definite limit of 30 days on such sessions, and there is no legal way by which the time may be extended. Things are complicated, too, by the fact that our last day of budget session will fall on Easter Sunday. Ordinarily, we

have always recessed for the three-day Easter weekend. A big ray of hope that we may be able to finish our chores on the 1964-65 budget by the deadline has just been thrown by the fact that the Assembly Ways and Means Committee has now reported out the Budget Bill. As a result, it may be possible to complete action on the bill soon enough to recess as usual. Our special session has no time

limit, of course, so it will probably continue for some weeks. To the surprise of many, the committee actually recommended a total budget of close to \$3.67 billion, up some \$9.5 million over the amount requested by the Governor. The bill was unanimously endorsed by the committee. However, Republican members of the group asserted that they voted for it only to get the bill on the floor of the Assembly

early, not necessarily because they approve its items. THE CHAIRMAN of the Ways and Means group said that more than \$10 million had been cut from the administration's original proposals, but that the Committee also added enough more millions to shove the total even higher. He said that he would oppose any reductions which might be attempted on the floor.

Among the major cuts which have so far been noted are a capital outlay item of \$1.2 million for a new public health laboratory in Los Angeles; another item of \$600,000 for state colleges, including a controversial half-million dollars for research; and \$643 million for support of the Department of Justice.

Other reductions include \$500,000 from the legislative contingent fund, from which

operating costs of the Legislature are paid; and \$450,000 from mental hygiene funds.

THE LARGEST addition to the budget is an item of \$10.4 million for a central heating and cooling plant for state buildings in Sacramento. Others include an item of \$775,000 to complete the roads at Frenchman Reservoir in Plumas County; and another of \$300,000 to increase the undergraduate medical program at the University.

The Senate Finance Committee, as of now has not finished work on its draft of the budget measure. Like its Assembly companion, the bill must be reported by the committee and finally passed by the whole Senate. Since the versions passed by the two houses will probably differ in major respects, the differences will then have to be ironed out in a free conference committee.

If it proves impossible to complete this entire procedure by the legal adjournment date for the budget session, the only way in which a budget can be enacted for 1964-65 will be to add the budget to the items in the Governor's call for our special session. If it is included, there will be no legal time limit controlling action on it. The possibility of its getting entangled in other hot issues of the extra session will obviously be increased.

## Navy Seeks Enlistments By 'Buddies'

The Navy will continue its "Enlist With Your Buddy Program" for high school graduates, according to Torrance recruiter, Chief Dwaine S. Arland.

Under the program, two or more buddies can enlist together to assist themselves in the transition from civilian to military status while undergoing indoctrination at the Naval Training Centers.

New recruits may select to take their nine weeks training at either the Great Lakes, Ill., or San Diego naval bases. On completion of recruit training, they return home on 14 days leave before embarking for a trade school or ship or shore station.
