(Continued from Page One) the office of Crom & Ferguson, one of the finest architectural firms in America.

After graduation he returned to his father's Michigan farm with the determination to increase his knowledge of materials used in building, and there built a forge for iron work that was later to make him widely known as a fine ornamental iron craftsman.

His next move was to New York to become associated with Oscar Bach, who is unquestionably the best known iron worker in the United States, and it was while there that an offer came

from the University of Michigan to join the faculty of its school of architecture. During the three years at Ann Arbor he also operated his own ornamental iron shop.

At this point in his life he took a very carefully planned trip to Europe, and while visiting Sweden to study the work of that country's greatest copper smith, was invited to stay there for six months to study under that master. During his stay in Europe, he visited all of the countries on the continent to study the architecture wonders of the old world.

After his return to the United States he settled in Washington, D. C., to spend four years with

the Construction Quartermaster's Department, and while acting as a project analyst for the U. S. Housing Administration, again built a forge for more study in his favorite subject, iron.

The next three and a half years he spent in South America to design hospitals and nursing schools for the Coordinator of Inter-American Affairs. His return to the United States brought him to the Southland to make his home at Palos Verdes.

Before becoming associated with Wood, Hite & Quigley, architect and engineers, 1524 Cravens, Wood was associated with Paul Williams, well known Los Angeles architect, and was responsible for the design of the beautiful St. Nicholas Orthodox church of Los Angeles.

He is a member of the American Institute of Architects, Palos Verdes Breakfast club, Palos Verdes Arts association, and the Episcopal church. In addition to his other accomplishments, Wood is also a fine pianist and an authority on good music.

For relaxation he enjoys square dancing and a fast game of tennis. He is single.

The offices of Wood, Hite & Quigley are very active as they have on the boards many beautiful and elaborate homes to be built in Palos Verdes and have also designed a project of 120 houses to be constructed of gunite concrete, an innovation in the

building field. Among their Torrance activities is an extensive remodeling job on one of the Sam Levy buildings.


