TORRANCE — The proposed Harbor Freeway "the most stupid plan of the entire freeway program," Councilman Hahn asked the city council to consider a resolution calling on the State Department of Public Works and the State Highway Division to change its plan.

Hahn outlined a proposed route for the Harbor Freeway in his resolution. He would have the Harbor Freeway follow the Pacific Electric tracks through Compton to the Union station at Alameda and Aliso, out of reach for Torrance and Peninsula folk.

As now planned, it would follow the usual route taken by residents of Torrance and the Harbor Area in traveling to Los Angeles — Figueroa, Broadway, and that general area.

Councilman Hahn's resolution brought from Harbor Area Councilman George Moore this statement:

"We have a common nuisance here with us again, and he is setting himself up against all of the experts and the opinions of the engineers who have spent month in the work of routing this highway. I had believed that he had been taught to think and to study before he leaped."

Hahn's resolution asserted that the proposed freeway route between Broadway and South Figueroa street would destroy and uproot thousands of homes,
