To the Editor, Peninsula Press:

You have requested the various candidates for the city council to declare themselves on the gambling issue in Torrance. We thought we had clearly emphasized that we were unalterably opposed to ALL types of public gambling, — not only the minor forms such as, punch-boards, pin ball and marble games, but more importantly the major types of big-stake gambling practiced in public gambling halls, which are run and controlled by "big-town" gang-

sters. This latter group is the crowd that U. S. Attorney General McGrath this week asked authority from Congress to smash, — characterizing such gambling done as the underworld's biggest source of revenue.

Of course, we favor the complete elimination of punch-boards, bill ball and marble games, also, we believe such devices are a bad influence on children.

However, we hope that emphasis that is being placed upon these penny-ante forms of gambling is not being used by

some candidates as a camouflage to conceal their promises to big-time gambling operators who are anxious to open public poker halls in Torrance.

We also favor the operation of an efficiently operated municipal bus system with modern equipment.
