neth joined the Civilian Conservation Corps and spent a year in camp. His next move was to Fargo, N. D., where he landed a job with the Fargo Glass and Paint Company as a warehouseman. After a year in that job he moved on to San Francisco and spent the following 2½ years as an apprentice with a large glass company. After receiving his union card he accepted a position traveling 10 mid-western states with headquarters at Indianapolis. In 1940 he fulfilled a life-long ambition by moving to the Southland, and, after arriving in Los Angeles, accepted a position in the construction department of the W. P. Fuller Paint and Glass Company. Among the large jobs on which he worked was the Consolidated plant at San Diego, where he and seven other men installed 180,000 panes of glass in four months.

During October of 1942 Olson entered the service of the U. S. Navy and spent 25 months on the equator in the Pacific. At the time of his discharge, January, 1946, he was rated a Chief Ship-fitter. While stationed on Manus Island of the Admiralty group he met his brother, Gordon, also a Navy man, and on that chance meeting the Olson Glass Company, 1635 Carson, was born. Immediately after the war the Olson brothers acquired a lot and let a contract for the construction of their business building. They have since added 2000 square feet of space. Kenneth is a member and treasurer of the local Lion's club, Torrance Post VFW, Redondo Beach Lodge No. 1378, BPOE, and the Lutheran church.

Olson's gracious wife is a native of Torrance and was well known in the community as Betty Jeanne Volz prior to their marriage here on June 14, 1941. One lovely daughter, Sandra Lee, age 1, completes the family circle.

When time permits away from his business, which has grown county-wide in its scope, he enjoys fishing, either deep sea or fresh water, bowling and his television set.


