Clyde Doyle, representative of the 18th District, left by plane last week for Washington, D. C. He spent a few days during Easter recess in the district and gave notice that he expected to return shortly for the June primaries.

While Doyle was home, it was announced from Washington that a fifty bed Naval Dispensary for Naval Dependents' Hospitalization would be promptly inaugurated at Terminal Island Naval Base. Doyle reported that eight doctors and eleven nurses would be assigned to it.

Congressman Doyle also informed his constituents that the select lobby investigating committee of which he is a member will resume its public hearings and that the subcommittee on military hospitals of which Doyle is a member, will also promptly file its report and recommendations as to future Congressional policy in such matters.
