Walteria Group Holds Luncheon



Flower Show Planned For June 24-25

LOMITA—Children of the Harbor area are vying with their elders in enthusiasm for the Community Flower show to be held June 24 and 25. Keen interest is shown by the flood of inquiries pouring into the planning committee headed by Mrs. George D. Hunt.

Requests for reservations by amateur and commercial growers indicates that the 90 by 63 ft. space in the recreation building of Lomita park where the display is to be held will be transformed into a fairland of beauty.

Judging of exhibits and awarding of ribbons will precede the opening of the show at 3 p.m. on Saturday. Sunday's program from 10 a.m. to 10 p.m. will be highlighted by selections by a county band, and colored slides of the newest Fuchsia introductions.

There will be no entry fee or admission charges, committee members said today. The Lomita area branch of the California Fuchsia Society, and the L.A. County Department of Parks and Recreation have issued the following schedule of divisions for the guidance of persons planning to enter exhibits: section 1, flower arrangement; 2, specimen blooms; 3, cut flowers; 4, potted plants; 5, rare and unusual plants, Orchids, etc.; 6, garden arrangements; 7, school exhibits; 8, hanging baskets; 9, commercial exhibits.

Subdivisions, rules and regulations will be published at a later date, said John Ericson, Fuchsia club president, said.
