

P-TA Raises \$1,460 for District Health Center

SHOESTRING — One of the many highlights of the Lomita-San Pedro Council June Breakfast held at the Assistance League, in San Pedro, Wednesday, was the donation of a check for \$1,460.56 to the 10th District P-TA Health Center. Mrs. Don Wolf, president of the Council, presented the check to Mrs. E. R. Brooker, Director of Harbor Health Clinic, who accepted the check on behalf of Mrs. Marvin Owen, president of the 10th District.

The Lomita-San Pedro Council Health Center Fund Drive started April 18 with the Orange Street Gay Nineties Revue, with a goal of \$1400 to be reached by June 30, and with the full cooperation of the thirteen schools in the council, the goal was fully attained. Halldale P-T.A. was most happy to be a part of the program.

Mrs. Don Wolf presented these interesting facts about the P-T.A. Health Center: It will be located at 312 N. 21st Street, Los Angeles, there will be eight lots for parking space, the building rooms, one private waiting

ing will cover an area of 60,000 square feet, the auditorium will seat 490 people, the 10th District will have nine offices, a lecture room, restroom, solarium, kitchenette, and closets, the State P-T.A. will have seven offices, a restroom, kitchenette, and closets. School Guidance will have twenty-three rooms, two reception, conference room, restroom, storage, and kitchenette. The Medical Clinic will have thirty-nine rooms, including a laboratory, restroom, kitchenette, and movable partitions allowing adjustment, the Dental Clinic will have twelve rooms, a waiting room, closet, restroom and storage, the Main Lobby will have reception rooms, elevator and halls, there will be entrances to all parts of the building without interference in any department.

Mrs. Wolf stated that this undertaking by a single parent-teacher district is unprecedented in the annals of the National P-T.A.

(Continued from Page One) and Benstead gained over Blount when this rule was applied to ballots which had been improperly allowed and counted by the Precinct Boards.

4. An unexplainable and irreconcilable situation has arisen with reference to the recount in Precincts numbers 7 and 21 when compared with the sealed tallies made by the Precinct Boards in these two Precincts. Precinct No. 7 showed 203 ballots cast. This was the exact amount as returned by the Precinct Board. In Court the Judge ruled 2 Benstead ballots and 2 Blount ballots invalid. The valid ballots then counted showed a result of 89 for Benstead, 46 for Blount. The Precinct Board in duplicate sealed envelopes showing their original tally sheets COUNTED 98 votes for Benstead and 48 for Blount. Do we conclude that the Election Board, consisting of 5 persons could not count the 293 ballots correctly and over-counted Benstead's ballots by 7? An identical situation arose in Precinct 21. There were 141 ballots counted in Court, which tally exactly with the official canvass. All votes were found to be valid. In Court there were counted 51 votes for Benstead and 36 for Blount. The Precinct Board in these sealed duplicate tally lists counted 57 for Benstead, 36 for Blount. Again it would seem that

they overcounted 6 votes for Benstead—if this is the answer. Following is the result of the recount by precincts.

Precinct 1: Blount 92, Benstead 35. Judge discarded 1 Benstead ballot marked in pencil.
 Precinct 2: Blount 37, Benstead 22. One Blount and 1 Benstead ballot rejected.
 Precinct 3: Blount 23, Benstead 58. No change.
 Precinct 4: Blount 62, Benstead 61. Blount gained 1. Apparent four voters spoiled and used two ballots each.
 Precinct 5: Blount 22, Benstead 27. Judge ruled two invalid for Blount and one for Benstead on account of blots and marks on the ballots.
 Precinct 6: Blount 28, Benstead 54. One Benstead ballot invalidated. Blount gained one.
 Precinct 7: Blount 46, Benstead 89. Judge ruled invalid two for each candidate.
 Precinct 8: Blount 45, Ben-

stead 68. Judge ruled 3 votes for Blount invalid.
 Precinct 9: Blount 28, Benstead gained 1.
 Precinct 10: Blount 23, Benstead 49. One invalid for Benstead. Benstead gained 1.
 Precinct 11: Blount 43, Benstead 66. Two voided ballots.
 Precinct 12: Blount 13, Benstead 55. Two spoiled ballots.
 Precinct 13: Blount 21, Benstead 58. No change.
 Precinct 14: Blount 91, Benstead 51. Blount gained 2. One voided ballot.
 Precinct 15: Blount 28, Benstead 69. Benstead gained 1.
 Precinct 16: Blount 12, Benstead 56. No changes.
 Precinct 17: Blount 46, Benstead 54. One spoiled ballot.
 Precinct 18: Blount 47, Benstead 56. Benstead gained 2. Judge ruled 1 valid for Blount.
 Precinct 19: Blount 22, Benstead 38. No changes.
 Precinct 20: Blount 46, Benstead 49. No returned election

supplies in envelope.
 Precinct 21: Blount 36, Benstead 51. No change.
 Precinct 22: Blount 50, Benstead 44. Blount lost 1, void.
 Precinct 23: Blount 9, Benstead 39. No change.
 Precinct 24: Blount 51, Benstead 9. No change. No string as requested.
 Precinct 25: Blount 147, Benstead 24. No change.
 Precinct 26: Blount 46, Benstead 86. One voted, no marks.
 Precinct 27: Blount 84, Benstead 25. One void.
 Precinct 28: Blount 78, Benstead 17. One spoiled, 1 void.
 Precinct 29: Blount 55, Benstead 14. One void, one rejected. No string on ballots. Envelope broken and sealed with Scotch tape.
 Precinct 30: Blount 84, Benstead 17. No string on ballots.
 Final count was Blount 1415, and Benstead 1398.
