Near East Shows Bldg. Boom Reports Walker

"The Jews in Israel are doing a grand job. They have nothing to go on, and yet, they have accomplished a great deal." This was the impression Blaine Walker, secretary to the Chamber of Commerce, and Mrs. Walker brought home with them after a several week sojourn through the Mediterranean and Near East countries.

Their travels took them to Italy, Yugoslavia, Greece, Turkey, Israel and Egypt, with stops in most of the larger seaports in these countries.

Walker reports that he found that every country was friendly to the "American dollar," and that the teeming crowds of visitors in Italy during the Holy Year included many Americans.

"We found very few American travelers outside of Italy," Walker said, "and everywhere things were expensive and crowded."

"One of the most unusual sights during our entire trip was our arrival in Istanbul, Turkey. You arrive at the Bosphorus, and anchor at what is called the Golden Horn. At this point you unload cargo from anchorage, not from the docks. The harbor was alive with activity of all types.

"The next morning, we looked out over the harbor and found approximately 200 small row-boats in the center of activity calmly fishing. They traveled from one side of the harbor to the other with seeming indifference to the boundary which exists.

"In Israel, we also found a tremendous amount of activity and advancement. This was the only place where we were really able to get a close view of the interior. There we found many collective farms which take care of the D.P.'s from the European countries. The D.P.'s are brought in and placed in large tent cities where they remain for a short period of time. From there they are placed on farms on a share and share alike basis.

"Construction is in full swing throughout the Mediterranean. Mostly homes and business

places. War scars were not too prominent in the places which we visited. They are still visible, but new construction is rapidly replacing the scars.

"On the whole, our trip was most interesting, and enlightening. We found excellent transportation throughout Italy, and tremendous advancement throughout the entire area."
