Caldwell is active in fraternal, civic and religious affairs.


Planning Trip

1177 Go to Summer Sessions

The Torrance Unified School District reported the following attendance data up to June 20, for its summer sessions.

Regular Classes
June 19—Torrance Elementary 196, Perry 106, Seaside 127. Total 429. June 20—Torrance Elementary 193, Perry 117, Seaside 137. Total 447.

Music Groups
June 19—Torrance Elementary 58, Perry 24, Seaside 49. Total 131. June 20—Torrance Elementary 80, Perry 36, Seaside 56. Total 170.

(Of this total of music students only 58 are not enrolled in regular classes, which means that the music program is still adding 14.5 a. d. a. to the district total. The music program thus is not self-supporting, and to be maintained it will need to be supported by the regular classes or by the district at a cost of approximately \$150 for the summer. At the present time it appears the regular classes will support it. Also the music program will have to be curtailed in some way as it is impossible to provide instruction for 170 pupils each day.)

Financial Breakdown
The average cost of all teacher salaries, including the music instructors, is \$188.50 per day.

Compared to the a. d. a. apportionment this would amount to the following:

June 19 a. d. a. 443.5—\$230 — \$168.50 = +\$61.50.
June 20 a. d. a. 461.5—\$240 — \$168.50 = +\$71.50.

The balance is necessary to offset cost of supplies, service and custodial costs and a. d. a. loss because of school holidays.
