to the center of the shopping district. The closest they come to the stores which need to double their retail business in order to match other nearby cities is on Marcelina avenue, Carson street or Torrance boulevard.

The lines due for approval are substantially as follows:

1. Los Angeles line terminates at the bus station, eliminating the loop run to Greenleaf avenue.
2. Waveria line extends from 101 highway, to Narbonne avenue, south on Hawthorne to Newton street, and east on 10 highway, to Narbonne avenue, north to Arlington avenue, Carson street and the bus station. Part of these buses will make the Carson street, Greenleaf, Torrance boulevard loop.
3. The Kettler Knolls-El Camino College line will run from 235th street and Western avenue, travel through both old and new sections of Kettler Knolls to Cabrillo, north to Torrance boulevard, then to Western avenue; north to 182nd street; west to Crenshaw boulevard and north to El Camino College. The bus will make a loop east on Redondo Beach boulevard to Arlington avenue, travel south on Arlington, and turn back to Crenshaw boulevard on 160th street.
4. The Long Beach line will extend from Long Beach to the bus station, and then travel Border avenue, Arlington avenue and 203rd street, to Crenshaw boulevard, then north to 174th street, west to Prairie, south to 182nd street, west to Hawthorne boulevard, north to Redondo Beach boulevard, east to Prairie and back to 174th street for the return trip over the same route.

New 'Regs' In Home Buying For Veterans

New GI home loan regulations go into effect today for the more than 13,000,000 World War II veterans who have not yet used GI Bill benefit to buy or build a home.

Veterans Administration said probably the most important aspect of the regulations to veterans is that providing for the use of the new 60 per cent guarantee up to \$7,500.

The new guarantee is available only to those veterans who who not used all or part of the old 50 per cent guarantee up to \$4000 home home loans.

OLD OR NEW

For veterans who have not used either the old or the new guarantee the regulations provide that they may take advantage of either, but that this is a matter for the veterans and the lenders to negotiate between them.

Veterans who elect to use \$4000 or more of the new guarantee but not all of the \$7500 maximum have no further entitlement to the remaining amount under the law.

The new regulations also set up mandatory minimum construction requirements for new homes started on or after June 19, 1950 with GI loans. Similar requirements for new construction have been in effect for some time on a voluntary basis, but this is the first authority granted VA to make them mandatory.

The regulations designate eligible unremarried widows as veterans in their own right. This

enables them to use the full amount of the new \$7500 guarantee, even though their husbands had used all or part of the old \$4000 guarantee before their deaths.

Unremarried widows may qualify for the guarantee if their husbands died as the result of service in World War II. The husband must have served in the armed forces at some period between September 16, 1940 and July 25, 1947, and his death must have been a result of service while on duty or most have resulted from a service-connected cause following discharge under conditions other than dishonorable. A further condition is that the widow must not have remarried following the veteran's death.

The new regulations further provide that VA, under certain conditions, may restore the loan guaranty rights of veterans who already have used their entitlement to purchase property which they later lost through condemnation or by fire or other natural hazard, or for some other compelling cause "devoid of fault on the part of the veteran."

NEW REGULATION

VA is now completing instructions for its field offices to administer this regulation. In addition, VA is drafting regulations to administer the provision of the law which enables VA to make direct loans to eligible veterans in certain areas where 4 percent financing is not available from other sources. This provision becomes effective July 19, 1950.

VA said that on or about July 19, 1950, its field offices will announce the list of designated areas eligible for direct loans. Application forms for veterans'

use will be available in the field office at that time.

VA and the Federal Housing Administration already have taken joint action under the law to limit fees and other charges which may be made against builders and veterans in connection with construction and sale of homes financed through GI and FHA loans. This joint action was announced June 28, 1950.


