Buckling of Scaffold Kills Torrance Man

Buckling of a scaffold while painting the inside of a Southern California Gas Company storage tank last Monday afternoon hurtled William F. Dallman, 342 Parsons street, Torrance, and three other men 225 feet to their death.

The accident occurred at the gas company's Dumommun and Center street plant.

Other dead are: Eugene Wylie, 1055 Senate Drive, San Pedro; John B. Reed, 3570-A Gage avenue, Bell, and Eugene Box, Plaza Court, San Pedro.

Two other painters, Oscar B. Abbott and Elmer Lawson, had walked off the scaffolding 30 seconds before it buckled.

Those killed were standing on a plank scaffold stretched across aluminum beams.

All the dead were employed by the Acme Maintenance Engineering Company, which had contracted to paint the tank.

Increase In Federal Taxes

The fact that an increase in federal taxes, due to the Korean war and the explosive world situation, appears inevitable must not be permitted to discourage Californians from trying to eliminate local tax extravagances and injustices, James O.
