Decorating Topics

IN ARRANGING your living room furniture try to place the sofa so that it faces you as you enter. It always seems such a negative welcome to have the back of the sofa greet you from the entrance door. The best location for a sofa is flat against the longest wall of the living room. A sofa, however, may be placed in front of a window or at a right angle on one side of a fireplace. Never place it across a corner or slanting out from the fireplace. Nor is it good to place it in the center of the room in front of a fireplace unless the room is very large.

The sectional sofa is often a solution to the problem of inadequate wall space as sections may be arranged in many different ways including a corner arrangement or a bay window grouping.

Always remember that sofas and chairs are never complete in themselves, however comfortable and attractive they may be. Each seating piece needs a useful table within reach as well as a good light near enough for reading, sewing or working at your handicraft.

Junior College Registration Dates Scheduled

Registration for new and old students at El Camino College will be held Sept. 11, 12 and 13, according to H. J. Sheffield, director of student personnel. Registration for veterans is scheduled for Sept. 6. Classes will begin Sept. 14.

A special period, Sept. 13 from 6 to 8 p.m. has been set aside for registration of extended day students who are unable to enroll at earlier hours. Regular registration hours for both day and evening students is:

Former El Camino students: Surnames beginning H through Q, Sept. 11, 9 a.m. to 2 p.m.; surnames beginning A through G, Sept. 11, 2 p.m. to 8 p.m.; surnames beginning R through Z, Sept. 12, 9 a.m. to 2 p.m.

New students attending El Camino College for the first time: Surnames beginning H through Q, Sept. 12, 2 to 8 p.m.; surnames beginning A through G, Sept. 13, 9 a.m. to 1 p.m.; surnames beginning R through Z, Sept. 13, 1 to 6 p.m.

Students unable to register during their schedule hours may register at any time following their assigned period.

Prior to registration new students should file with the director of student personnel an application for admission and transcripts of high school and college work previously taken. New students and some former students also are required to take the English placement and mathematics, chemistry and business qualification tests scheduled for Sept. 2.

City Water Dept. Seeks Pumpers, Maintenance Men

The city of Inglewood has openings for water service maintenance men and pumping plant operators.

Applicants for the position of water service man should have a general working knowledge of water service maintenance practices and procedure. The one-year city residence requirement is waived, however, applicants must reside in Inglewood at the time of applying.

Those filing for the position of pumping plant operator should possess a working knowledge of the operation and maintenance of pumping plant equipment. The age requirement is between 25 and 40 years of age. The one-year city residence is also waived in this instance but the appointees for the position must reside in Inglewood within six months after the appointment is received.

Those interested in these jobs are asked to file their applications with the personnel office in the city hall at 105 East Queen street. Deadline for receiving applications is 5 p.m., Friday, Sept. 8, 1950.
