

### "Red Riding Hood" At Alondra Park This Fall

"Red Riding Hood," a fantasy-opera, will be presented this fall, Dec. 24, at Alondra Park under the sponsorship of the County Department of Parks and Recreation. It was announced Tuesday by Supervisor Raymond V. Darby of the Board of Supervisors of Los Angeles County.

"This is the second of a series of high class musical events to be presented by our parks department under the sponsorship of E. P. Gruendyke, director, and La Rue Hillier, musical supervisor," Supervisor Darby said. "The first was the Music of Arts Festival conducted at Garvey Park, June 11, which met with pronounced success."

"These presentations are designed to provide opportunity for a highly talented group of artists and musicians to learn how to present a musical theatrical production with emphasis on the commercial aspect including financing, overhead, cost of production, publicity and other phases."

Libretto and music of the production were prepared by Homer Simmons, composer, widely known in music and theatrical circles. Direction will be by Betty Farrington, actress, motion picture player and for seven years' director of the Inglewood Community Players. The cast will include such well known names as Marilyn Taylor, Beth Farnum, Emil Oberjat and William Davis.

Admission to the opera will be without charge but an average of thirty cents per seat is required to defray expenses, donations for reserved seats are being accepted in applications to Homer Simmons, Box 635, Sunland, Calif.

### El Camino College Offers Season Football Tickets

El Camino College announced that a season ticket covering 6 home football games to be played in its college stadium at Crenshaw and Redondo Beach Boulevards are available at the price of \$5.

General admission for these games would regularly cost \$6. Special Booster tickets, only 500 of which are being offered for sale, will result in not only a saving of \$1 in the purchase price but guarantee seats in a reserve section near the 50 yard line.

The purpose of this offer, according to a college spokesman, is to give football fans who have become ardent followers of the Warrior gridsters assurance that they will have better seats with-

out having to line up and wait for regular ticket sales.

### Contract Let For Harbor Fire Station

Ground-breaking of Harbor City Station 85 is scheduled to start in mid-September, according to Arthur Scroggs, of the board of public works.

Scroggs said the board awarded the contract for construction of a new Harbor City station at 1339 W. 253rd street at the Carter Mack Builders low bid of \$55,950. It was one of six bids.

Available funds for both projects were approved in the 1947 Fire Protection bond issue, Scroggs said.

A single unit station, the Harbor City station, will provide quarters for crew and hall for engine and equipment. A kitchen will also be included.

### El Nido Park Land Approved

Initial move for a park in the El Nido area was taken by the board of supervisors Tuesday. When it approved notice of intention to purchase 11.39 acres of land about a mile and a half south of Redondo Beach Blvd., and a half mile west of Hawthorne Avenue.

Supervisor Raymond V. Darby reported that the entire plot of land planned for the park comprised 22.78 acres.

The Lloyd Corporation, Ltd., of Beverly Hills has consented to sell its parcel of 11.39 acres for the sum of \$5895, while the remaining 11.39 acres owned by the Dabney Estate, will have to be condemned for public purpose.

Darby stated at the same time, that a portion of the county's newly acquired riding and hiking trail extends through the property.
