School Clerk Course at Harbor Tech

A new two-section course in Educational Secretaryship, designed to train adults for elementary and high school office positions, is now open to enrollment at Harbor Junior College, according to Raymond J. Casey, director.

In the course, training in the routines of a school office will be combined with training in general secretarial skills such as typing, shorthand, and business machines.

In the School Correspondence class, which will meet on Monday evenings from 5:00 to 7:00 p.m., instruction will cover business letter writing, report making, bulletin writing, basic principles of filing, and the use of the mimeograph and mimeoscope office machines as they are used in schools.

In the School Office Procedures class, which will meet on Wednesday evenings from 5:00 to 7:00 p.m., such related topics as job planning, health office services, textbook and library procedures, Audio-Visual aids services, and the requisitioning of supplies and equipment will be taught.

Miss Lillian Mills, who has held the position of executive school secretary with the Los Angeles Board of Education for the past eight years, will be the class instructor.

Persons interested in enrolling in either or both of the course sections may do so in the class meetings themselves during the next two weeks, or in the Counseling Office of the local college.

"The course is open to any adult who wishes to prepare for the various openings in school offices, and to any person already in a school office position who wishes to prepare for the promotional examinations in the field," Miss Mills stated.

A new evening class in Speech Training, in which special attention will be given to the personal needs of the class members, is now open to enrollment at Harbor Junior College, according to Harold A. McCarter, evening coordinator.

Experience and training in extemporaneous and impromptu speaking, group leadership, and panel discussions, as well as training in voice production and tone placement will be offered in the new class, which will be taught by Mr. Dwight L. Garner, instructor of speech at the local college.

Persons interested in enrolling in the class, which will meet on Wednesday evenings at 7:00 p.m., can do so by attending the class meetings at any time during the next two weeks, or by registering at the Counseling Office during the daytime, Mr. Garner stated.

Service Will Not Cut G.I. School Plan

A recent Veterans Administration extension of the July 25, 1951 cut-off date for resuming GI Bill training applies only to veterans who already started their studies and are prevented from going on with them by reason of their return to active military or naval duty.

But, VA said, the extension does not apply to those veterans who had never had GI Bill training at the time they re-entered active service. For them, the July 25, 1951, date still holds. Exception for Military Service: Veterans who interrupt their studies in order to enter military service will be permitted to resume their training within a reasonable period following their release from service — even though they get out after the deadline date.

Under the law, the July 25, 1951, cut-off date applies to World War II veterans discharged before July 25, 1947. For those few discharged afterwards, the cut-off date is four years from date of discharge.

Chaplain From Torrance Sent For Training

Chaplain (1st Lt.) Thomas A. Gannon, of 2077 W. 37th St., Torrance, recently called into Federal service with Southern California's 40th Infantry Division, has been ordered to Carlisle Barracks, Penn., for six weeks of special training, after being stationed at Camp Cooke, Calif. Subjects treated in the course for chaplain company officers include administration, military custom and courtesy, religious morale factors, personal counseling, and troop information for chaplains.

Chaplain Gannon will rejoin his unit, the 115th Medical Battalion, upon completion of the school which will be conducted from September 27 to November 8.

Former chaplain of Los Angeles County General Hospital, Chaplain Gannon had been serving as assistant director of the Catholic Welfare Bureau, Los Angeles Archdiocese, prior to his induction into federal service.
