QUESTION: WHAT HAVE YOU DONE TO COOPERATE IN THE DRIVE TO RAISE RECREATIONAL EQUIPMENT FOR LOCAL SOLDIERS STATIONED IN CAMP COOKE?

MRS. ALMA WAINE, 250 Monterey boulevard, Hermosa Beach: "I have heard about the drive undertaken by the Hermosa Women's club, but so far, I haven't done anything about it, I'm sorry to say. However, I think it's a very good thing that they're doing, and I certainly want to cooperate in any way I can. I know I have a lot of old magazines laying around the house, and up until now, I didn't know what to do with them. But I suppose the boys up there will welcome them, and it's the least I can do for them, so I'm going to donate all my old magazines to the soldiers."

MRS. DENNIS WILTERN, 567 Avenue B, Redondo Beach: "So far, I've sent several piles of magazines for the boys, and I've also included several new numbers among them. They are now doing an awful lot for us, and I think the least we can do is send them something so they'll have something to do in their leisure hours. My husband was in the army during the last war, and he says you get pretty homesick when you have nothing to do. I'd hate to think anybody was that way on account of me not doing something to help them out when they need help."

JAMES VAN BRANDT, 190 Marine avenue, Manhattan Beach: "I had an old card table laying around my cellar, and it was in pretty good shape. So I took it out to my workshop, and I fixed up a couple of wobbly legs that looked as though they were ready to give up, and I got it in real good shape so the boys at camp could get some use out of it. I also threw in a couple of packs of new playing cards to give them something to do with it. Maybe I should have tossed in some dice, because when I was in the service, that was our favorite form of off-duty recreation."

ALEXANDER DUMROCK, 697 Sixteenth street, Hermosa Beach: "I did quite a bit to help out in this drive, because I thought it was a pretty good one. I was in the first world war, and even after all these years, I can remember what it was like to be lonely and have nothing to do when you're in camp. So I started a one-man drive to help out all I could, and I went around among my neighbors and collected books, magazines, and all those different kinds of table games, and I turned them over to the collection. I would have done more if I could have."

MRS. JOHN PALMER, 198 Fifteenth street, Hermosa Beach: "I did everything I could, too. I understood the boys wanted a lot of books, and we subscribe to one of those book of the month clubs, and we had a lot of books around the house that we haven't read as yet. But we figured we could always pick them up, and besides we have plenty more books coming. Therefore, we gave a lot of those books we never read to the camp, and we hope the soldiers from the South Bay will get as much pleasure out of them as we would want them to. I think the drive was a fine idea, and I'd be willing to contribute to one of those every month if they had one."
