

Centinela Board of Trustees Acts

Board of Trustees, Centinela Valley Union High School District, approved the substitution of sub-contractor, G. J. Weisbrod, Inc., in place of Sammons & Crowley, for the construction steel work on Morningside High School plant, at a meeting Thursday afternoon at Inglewood High School. Substitution of sub-contractors was endorsed as G. J. Weisbrod, Inc., has the steel on hand.

Al Barbas was employed as building inspector for Morningside beginning October 16.

Three tennis courts will be built at Leuzinger at a cost of approximately \$6,000. Miss Janis Huston was employed as cafeteria helper at Leuzinger.

Norman Arnt, Mrs. Ruth Soukup, Miss Beverly Smith and Wayne McGill were authorized to attend the convention of the California Scholarship Confederation, to be held in Fresno, on October 21.

It was decided that the regular meeting of the Board of Trustees, scheduled for October 21, will be held in the Inglewood High School study hall, at which time new teachers of the high school district will be present for an informal reception following the board meeting.

William Herbert, building inspector, sent in a semi-monthly report on the Inglewood High School auditorium, showing that the construction was 86.8 per cent completed, with the elapsed contract time, no extension, 11.8 per cent. Thirteen items are 100 per cent complete. They are pre-job expense, earth work, concrete, forms, reinforced steel, cement finish, masonry, structural and miscellaneous steel, rough carpentry, steel sash, roofing, lath and plaster, and sprinkler system.

All district employees will take a loyalty oath in conformity with

a recently passed state law. The Board of Trustees voted to take the same oath themselves.

Mrs. Sarah E. Nelms was employed as a substitute for Mrs. Flora Phillips, secretary, who is ill. Two Inglewood pupils were employed for one and one-half hours each day to assist with office typing.

Housing Authority Speaks at York PTA

Frank Wilkinson of the Los Angeles Housing Authority, discussed substandard housing and its relation to Proposition 10 at the York P.T.A. meeting last Thursday evening.

A motion picture of an actual survey taken in Los Angeles emphasized remarks about the hardships these substandard dwellings place on children reared in them, their parents, and the cost of the slums on the taxpayers through monies paid to them in subsistence, which pays the rent.

The speaker stressed the importance of better housing from the standpoint of public welfare, health and the most of police and fire protection.

Miss Stella Broholm, principal, added that she had made a tour through the very locale of the picture last summer with a University Workshop class and had spoken to many of the occupants.

A social hour, hosted by the Sixth Grade Room Mothers, followed the meeting.
