\$660 Raised Of Advance Gifts Quota

"I am convinced that this division will go over the top within the next week," Sears said.

Streets' Need Of Cleaning Causes Decay

Failure of the city street department to keep some new streets clean is causing pavement to deteriorate, according to a complaint lodged with officials this week.

In one instance, on Lincoln avenue at Western avenue, water and mud constantly course down the gutters from the Kettler Knolls tract, and grass is growing up through the pavement which is less than a year old.

In other new areas, similar conditions exist, it was pointed out.

Unless the gutters are kept clean of mud and growth, it is feared the pavement will break up under the constant traffic on the streets.

Lomita Gets Zoning Change

A commercial zoning for Lomita's Business District was approved by the Board of Supervisors last week.

Supervisor Raymond V. Darby announced that the frontage on the Pacific Coast Highway in Lomita, extending from the city limits of Los Angeles to the city limits of Torrance—a strip of almost one and a half miles—was zoned C-3. There were no protests from residents of the area.

It is anticipated that the ordinance will be presented to the Supervisors at next week's meeting for final adoption.
