





Harbor City Man Killed In Hungnam

Killed Dec. 8, in the Hungnam area was Corp. Horacia N. Montez, 34, of 1004 W. 253rd st., according to his sister, Mrs. Dolores Logano.

Montez, a veteran of four years of combat, had been in service five months with the First Marine Division.

During World War II, he served in the Pacific theatre and received six commendations for volunteering for hazardous missions, his sister related.

He and his commanding officer, who was unidentified, were reported killed at the same time. Montez leaves his wife Zoradia, a daughter Linda Christian and a brother Mike of the harbor area. Mrs. Montez is expecting another child.

Other relatives are his parents, six sisters and three brothers, all of Arizona.

Funeral Rites Of Accident Victim Held

Funeral services were held Monday at a local mortuary for Werner J. Marcz, 17, of 1441 W. Carson st., who was killed instantly in an accident Sunday morning.

Also injured in the mishap were the driver, Joseph Ulrich, 20 and two other passengers, Jack S. Seibert, 17, and Pedro Monrea, 19, all 1441 W. Carson st., Torrance.

Investigators said Ulrich's car brushed against another machine, skidded for more than 100 feet and then overturned. The occupants were hurled out the top of the auto, a 1936 model sedan.

Marcz was pronounced dead upon arrival at Harbor General Hospital, where the others were treated for cuts, bruises and other injuries.

Steel Worker Victimized Out of Salary

Victimized out of his \$120 pay check early last Saturday morning on Border ave., near Soule Steel Co., was Bob York, Columbia Steel worker, according to police report.

Capt. Ernest Ashton and Percy Bennett, police detectives investigating the case, said that three men enticed York into a game of Three Card Monte and were trying to get others into the game when Bill Phillips, Chief of Guards at Columbia Steel notified the Police Department. York and his wife, Dorothy, reside at 1728 Abalone st., Torrance.

New Aluminum Plant Opened By Local Firm

The Harvey Machine Co. of Torrance received approval from the Interior Department to construct a new aluminum plant at Kallispell, Montana, for the purpose of producing this strategic material.

Harvey operates an aluminum fabrication plant here and this plant is the largest independent producer of aluminum extrusions for the aircraft industry.

Under present plans, it is anticipated that the Montana plant of the Harvey company will begin operations in 1951. Operation of the new plant will enable the company to produce 72,000 tons of aluminum, which is roughly equivalent to 10 percent of the nation's pre-Korean total output of the vital material.

The new plant has been located in Montana because of an abundant supply of hydroelectric power created by the Hungry Horse Dam project will be available. Power is one of the major cost elements in aluminum production.
