

Inglewood Dumps L.H.S. Cagers 56-23

Inglewood's sharpshooting casabamen proved to be too powerful a foe for the Leuzinger quintet last Friday night when they dumped the visiting local squad 56-23.

Tomorrow night in Torrance, the Olympian five will be out to put another game in their win column at the expense of the oil city team. The Bee game gets underway at 7:30 and the varsity is slated to take the floor one hour later.

Bill Ferris ran roughshod over the Olympians for the entire length of last Friday's game. When the final buzzer sounded he had collected 21 points for himself.

Head man of the Leuzinger attack was Mike Stellino, who accounted for 10 points and left the game for the first time in the final seconds.

Dick Barr closely followed in the scoring column with 5 markers and Dick Lester potted 4. Starting center, Don Anderson sank 2 shots from the charity line and Bob Neal and Ercil Brown each had one point.

A second half rally by the Sentinel Bee team proved to be too much for the local midgets as they downed the Olympians in a preliminary contest 42-33.

The Leuzinger hoopers led 21-12 at half time but seemed to fall apart when the green and whites closed the gap with a flurry of accurate long shots.

Up until this disastrous sec-

ond half it looked like the Olympians had the game well in hand, playing better than par on both offense and defense.

Oppose Wiseburn Merger

Continental Valley Union High School District Board of Trustees has gone on record as being opposed to a petition to change the boundaries of Wiseburn School District and Manhattan Beach City School District. The action was taken at a special meeting of the Board of Trustees, held on Thursday.

Phillip W. Clancy was employed as inspector for the Hawthorne and Morningside high schools at a salary rate of \$500 per month. At Leuzinger, Hendrika E. Goughmour, Joella McLemore, and Ina Seddicum were employed as substitute or part-time cafeteria workers. Mrs. Mattie L. Set Deadline for Wage Reports

Deadlines for filing wage reports and contribution returns required under the California Unemployment Insurance Act for the fourth quarter of 1950 is January 31, Frank T. Pierce, auditor in charge of the State Department of Employment's audit office in Inglewood reminded local employers.

"Many employers have asked what effect the recent amendments to the federal social security laws have on the California Unemployment Insurance Act," Pierce said. "I want to emphasize that these changes in federal law do not alter the California law in any respect. Employers will complete their report forms just as they have in the past. Contributions to the state are limited to the first \$3,000 paid to any one employee by each employer during a calendar year."
