'Your Potential Possibilities' Religious Science Sunday Topic

"Your Potential Possibilities" is the sermon topic of Rev. Earl Barnum on Sunday morning, February 18 at the church of Religious Science in the Masonic Temple, Redondo Beach.

As Rev. Barnum stated "There is no way we can know God except by studying man. This is so because God reveals Himself thru us."

The force turned on but not lighted, misdirected and uncontrolled with no proper outlet means trouble and unhappiness, but when flowing thru the right channels and correctly lit, the warmth of a happy well-coordinated life results.

The Children's Church with a well directed program of activities in teaching a harmonious way of living meets at 11:00 a.m. The Junior Church which studies the same subjects as given in the sermon meets also at 11:00 with Adrian Bibebe in charge.

Lecture of Forum Series Scheduled At El Camino

"History through a Keyhole" is the title of the second free public forum lecture to be offered in the Campus Center of El Camino College on February 20 at 7:30 p.m. Albert S. Karr, history instructor, is the speaker. In his second talk professor Karr will discuss the difficulties faced by every citizen in trying to get a true picture of national and international events.

"Every individual and every nation finds it difficult to get an accurate perspective on his own past and current history. Yet, if he is to make intelligent decisions, he must see himself and his own people clearly and without distortion," according to Karr. His lecture will deal with methods of gaining a true picture of the international scene.

Third and fourth lectures of the series, to be presented on succeeding Tuesdays, February 27 and March 6, are titled "The Causes of War and the Conditions of Peace" and "Russia Versus the United States."

All lectures are free and open to the public. El Camino College is located at Crenshaw and Redondo Beach boulevards.
