

Plan Invest In Americo Observation

Thousands of Southern California communities will join in the observance of Invest in America Week, to begin next Monday with civic and service club meetings, and special events designed to spotlight the importance of investment in the national economy.

Reaching from Wasco to San Diego, and from Long Beach to the desert, business houses will display Invest in America Week posters and make available to customers literature about the week, according to Coordinating Chairman Emerson B. Morgan.

Invest in America Week will emphasize to the average citizen the importance of his stake in America, through his job, his ideas, his savings and his investments, according to Morgan.

Morgan pointed out there is an average investment of \$6,000 in every job in the nation. Capital investment in some jobs runs as high as \$40,000, he said.

Already planned for Invest in America Week will be a talk by Los Angeles Stock Exchange President W. G. Paul before the Los Angeles Breakfast Club on Wednesday, April 4. Colonel Robert S. Henry, vice-president of the Association of American Railroads, will address a joint meeting of the Electric and Transportation Clubs at the Biltmore on Monday, April 2, and James E. Day, president of the Midwest Stock Exchange comes to Los Angeles on Wednesday, April 4, to speak at a meeting of the Los Angeles Kiwanis and the Manufacturing and Industries Committee of the Los Angeles Chamber of Commerce.

Reveal Per Capita Cost Of Schools

According to a statement by Dr. C. C. Trillingham, Los Angeles county superintendent of schools, "It costs less than 13c a day for the average citizen in the county to pay for the education of elementary pupils, kindergarten through eighth grade."

Dr. Trillingham stated further that the average current school cost per elementary pupil in Los Angeles county was 57c per day, or 8.1c per pupil hour for 1950. "This amount," said the superintendent, "is only a fraction of the per hour cost of hiring a good baby-sitter."

The superintendent further revealed that the total average cost per elementary pupil per year, including all instructional services, health examinations, and transportation amounted to only \$209.56 during 1949-50.

The current annual cost to the 4,222,886 citizens of Los Angeles county (January estimate of the Regional Planning Commission) amounts to \$22.43 per person—making less than 13c per day, or about the price of a cut-rate "hot dog."

The superintendent stated that these comparisons are based upon the average amount of money, \$209.56, spent annually upon each elementary pupil in average daily attendance. A total of 452,170 pupils were estimated to be in average daily attendance during the fourth month of the current school year. The average cost per pupil, multiplied by the average daily attendance, gives a total cost of \$94,756,745.20. This cost, divided into the estimated population of Los Angeles county, 4,222,886, gives a cost of less than 13c per day to be paid by each citizen in the county.
