Points to Long Beach

Jordan further argued that telephone service by Associated in Long Beach now gives the company a 7.4 percent annual return on investment.

The company, however, is asking only 6.5 percent net return yearly on all installations in more than a score of Southland cities and communities.

Hence, Jordan concluded, Long Beach subscribers are in effect "paying for service elsewhere" because service is more available to them on a wider scale than elsewhere.

In another phase of the hearing, Company Atty. Donald Powers quizzed Col. K. Charles Bean of the Los Angeles Public Utility Department on how the latter arrived at certain fiscal conclusions relating to Associated's financial structure.

Actual percentages of monthly telephone rate increases sought in the Southern California communities from single-line home subscribers served by Associated were placed in the hearing record as follows:

- Covina, 75 percent; Downey, 110 percent; Fowler, 100 percent; Guadalupe, 140 percent; Huntington Beach, 115 percent; Laguna Beach, 115 percent; Lompoc, 140 percent; Long Beach, 115 percent; Ontario, 70 percent; Oxnard, 115 percent; Pomona, 85 percent; Redondo Beach, 93 percent; Reedley, 100 percent; San Bernardino, 130 percent; Santa Barbara, 118 percent; Santa Maria, 140 percent; Santa Monica, 90 percent; Santa Paula, 100 percent; West Los Angeles, 90 percent; and Whittier, 110 percent.

In seven communities extended service would be a supplant local service. These are Covina, Downey, Long Beach, Redondo, Santa Monica, West Los Angeles and Whittier.
