Rev. Shauer to Close Ministry at Central Church

"Jesus of Nazareth Passes By" will be the topic of Rev. N. S. Schauer's sermon at the 11 a. m. service of the Central Evangelical United Brethren Church, Marcelina and Arlington avenue. This service will close Rev. Schauer's ministry at Central Church.

At the annual California conference of the Evangelical United Brethren Church held in Santa Ana last week, Rev. Schauer received assignment to the Christ Community Church at 135th and Vermont avenue. This church is located in the community where another former pastor, the Rev. H. W. Roloff did preparatory work three years ago, while pastor here at Torrance. 


