## Slough Patrol Asked by Supervisors

Drowning of four youngsters in the Dominguez Slough area in the past month spurred the County Board of Supervisors into action Tuesday.

The board on a motion of Supervisor Raymond V. Darby, early this afternoon called on the sheriff's office and the Los Angeles police department to patrol the area.

The county counsel's office was requested to determine if law enforcement agencies under present regulations can prevent swimming and boating in the slough and in surrounding ponds.

In the absence of such authority the supervisors should pass an ordinance granting it, Darby said.

The patrol method was set up after the board agreed with the county flood control district that it would be too costly to pump out the accumulated waters in the area.

The Torrance City Council voted July 24 to appoint John R. Atkinson to serve his probationary period as construction inspector, effective July 15, 1951, at \$307 per month, the compensation set forth as the third step for the position.

Winifred E. Lawson was appointed by the group to serve his probationary period as assistant plumbing inspector, effective July 15, 1951, at \$272 per month, the compensation set forth as the first step for the position. Students who plan to take courses in English, Chemistry, Mathematics or Business should take one or more of the following placement tests on September 1:

**ENGLISH PLACEMENT TEST**  
The English Placement Test which is required of all regular students who have not previously completed a college English course will be held beginning at 9 a. m., 1 p. m. and 7 p. m. on September 1. The English Placement and other tests to be taken on this date will require approximately three hours. Students who fail to qualify on the English test will be required to register in English A.

**CHEMISTRY QUALIFICATION TEST**  
The Chemistry qualification test will be given September 1st at 12 noon and 6 p. m. This test is required of all students who expect to enroll in Chemistry 1A. Those who fail to qualify will be required to complete Chemistry 1A before proceeding to Chemistry 1A.

**MATHEMATICS QUALIFICATION TEST**  
The Mathematics qualification test will be given September 1st at 12 noon and 6 p. m. This test is required of all students who expect to enroll in Mathematics A (high school algebra). Those who fail to qualify will be required to complete Mathematics G before enrolling in Mathematics A.
