

'New Heaven and New Earth,' Religious Science Sermon Topic

When Redondo Beach was incorporated as a city Cates served as the first treasurer, a position he held for nearly a quarter of a century. Part of this time he served as deputy county assessor as well. He also served several terms on the City Council and later became Mayor, which office he held for eight years. After disposing of his livery stable, Cates established the first mortuary in Redondo Beach in 1895 which is still operating under the name of Sherfey and Myers.
