

Marymount of Palos Verdes Will Open September 25

Catholic officials announced this week that Marymount of Palos Verdes, the new \$250,000 school atop the Palos Verdes hills, would open September 25 and that Mother Cecelia of Corvallis School, San Fernando Valley, would be the school's first mother superior.

Marymount of Palos Verdes will be the third Marymount opened in Southern California and the third where Mother Cecelia has been the initial mother superior. She inaugurated Marymount Schools in Santa Barbara and Westwood.

Although ground for Marymount of Palos Verdes was broken only last St. Patrick's Day, construction has progressed rapidly and the school will be ready for opening the last week in September. Mother Gertrude of Marymount College, Westwood, said.

IN FINISHING STAGE

The original five structure—"students" residence hall, classroom building, kitchen and dining rooms, nuns' convent and administration-chapel building—already are up and in the finishing stage. Additional structures, including another dormitory and a shrine, will be started this fall.

Mother Cecelia and her staff, all nuns in the Institute of the Religious of the Sacred Heart of Mary, will move into the school about September 10. Until that date reservations can be made through Marymount School, 10643 Sunset Boulevard, Los Angeles.

Marymount of Palos Verdes, with a capacity of 200 pupils, will accept resident and day girl students from the first through twelfth grades. Boy day students will be accepted from the first through fourth grades. The school's curriculum and activities program will follow that in use at all other Marymount Schools.

ENROLLMENT BEGUN

School authorities reported that enrollment has begun, and that students already have registered from as far distant as Long Beach and Hermosa Beach. First student to register was Priscilla Eaton of Palos Verdes Estates.

Marymount of Palos Verdes, built in the rambling, Rolling Hills ranch-type style of the Palos Verdes peninsula, is located on a 25-acre site at Palos Verdes Drive East at Crest Road. It overlooks San Pedro, Portuguese Bend and the Catalina Channel from a 1,000-foot elevation. Dedication of the school is planned for late this fall.

All new students planning to enter Torrance High School this fall should register now in the high school Counseling Office. Registration will continue through Friday, September 14. The office is located off the lower hall of the main building at Carson and Watson Streets.

Counselors will be on duty between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 4:30 p.m. to assist transfer students with the preparation of class programs.

ROUTINE INFORMATION

Torrance High School will open for a full-day session on Monday, September 17, with a general meeting of the student body and faculty in the school auditorium scheduled for 8:10 a.m. A regular schedule of classes will be in effect on this opening day of school, with dismissal at the usual time of 3:05 p.m.

Attention of all new students is invited to the fact that the high school lunch period totals only 35 minutes—from 12:29 to 1:04 p.m. Only those students who live within easy walking distance from the high school campus will be granted lunch period off-campus passes. All others should come prepared to remain on campus during the lunch period; they may bring their own lunches, or use the high school cafeteria service.

Students and teachers who depend upon their own transportation are advised the area in front of the main building, and the high school campus proper, will not be available for parking during school hours. Roadside parking will be provided along Plaza del Amo, outside the fence which marks the western boundary of the campus.


