Normandie Opening to be Held Up

The opening of Normandie Avenue as scheduled for today will not be held because there are no protective signalling devices at the Pacific Electric Railway crossing, it was revealed. The Pacific Electric Railway Company was supposed to install No. 8 - Flashing Light Controls for the movement of the trains as warning to motorists at this location.

The Pacific Electric Company has not been able to secure these flashing lights because of the shortage of critical materials, the company reports. It is anticipated that they will not be able to have them until February.

Every effort is being made by the County to see if this situation can be remedied by the installation of some other type of temporary protective device. Application will be made to the Public Utility Commission which has control of such matters as a supplement to the original order permitting the County to put in a boulevard stop on each side of the tracks with proper illumination as a warning of oncoming trains, it was disclosed.

This, it was believed, will only be a temporary solution until such time as the original order of the Public Utilities Commission calling for the installation of flashing lights can be made by the Pacific Electric Railway Company.



Farina Pudding Is Served Many Ways



If you haven't before, it's time you met Farina Pudding—a most versatile and thrifty dessert. Today it's orange-flavored with a tangy Orange-Pineapple Sauce. Another day it's cherry-topped. You can bake it in a large mold or individual molds; you can serve it hot or serve it cold.

This is a basic recipe—the kind of dessert that's good for children because it's a breakfast cereal dessert, adding cereal's protein, vitamins, and minerals, and also contributing milk and eggs.

Cherry Pudding
To convert this recipe to a cherry-topped dessert, omit the orange rind and juice and add 1 teaspoon of vanilla. For the sauce, drain the syrup from canned Bing or sweet red cherries. Heat to the boiling point and thicken slightly with cornstarch (allow 2 teaspoons of cornstarch or 1 cup of juice). Boil for 5 minutes, then add the cherries.

Orange-Pineapple Sauce:
Combine 2 teaspoons cornstarch with 2 teaspoons cold water. Add to 1 cup canned crushed pineapple. If desired, thin with additional pineapple juice or water. Bring to a boil, stirring constantly; boil 3 minutes, cool. Add 1 cup orange sections.
