Baptist Church Bids Goodbye To Killman After Sun. Sermon

The First Baptist Church of Torrance bids farewell for a few months to their assistant pastor, Rev. J. Russell Killman. Some months ago Rev. Killman received a call to come over to the Island of Formosa and preach for Youth For Christ in the high schools, colleges and Chinese Army Camps.

FORMOSAN MESSAGE

This Sunday night Rev. Killman will preach a typical Formosan message which he will take in it's entirety from the Gospel of John. While on the island he will speak four times a day from this Gospel. The reason for using this Gospel only is because it is the only part of the Bible written in their language.

Rev. Killman will leave Friday night, February 1st, from the Inglewood Airport on the first stage of his flight to San Francisco. The next morning he will board the Philippine Air Lines to wing his way to Honolulu, Wake Island, Guam and then Manila. In Manila Rev. Killman will be speaking for the Far Eastern Broadcasting team. The next day he will take an inter-island plane for Formosa. The eight thousand mile trip will take but a short 41 hours flying time.

Rev. Killman states that he goes to Formosa as an ambassador from Torrance bringing the "good tidings of great joy that shall be to all people," for it has been the people of Torrance who have made this trip possible.

During his absence Mr. Douglas Jeffrey will be taking his place with the music of the church. Mr. Jeffrey is a student at the California Baptist Seminary.

Joan Davis, 19, who last September recovered from a brief seige of polio with the aid of the March of Dimes, had happier news today. Her husband was awarded the combat Infantryman badge for excellent performance of duty in combat with the 7th Infantry Division.

Mrs. Davis, who lives with her parents and nine-month-old son, Timothy, at 2144-238 street, was so excited when the Torrance Press informed her of her husband's latest military achievement that she was speechless.

TIMOTHY BORN

"Things looked so dark when Marvin left the States last June," Mrs. Davis said. "Timothy was born in April, and my husband didn't have much time to get acquainted with him."

Mrs. Davis explained that Davis entered the Army January 10, 1951. He is now serving as a carpenter in Headquarters and Headquarters Company of the 31st Regiment.

A former student of El Camino College, Davis was employed as a cabinet maker at Barnett's Cabinet Shop here in Torrance, before he entered the Army.

Davis' parents, Mr. and Mrs. Homer Davis, who live at 1225 Fern Ave., were also thrilled to hear the news.

ARMY BADGE

Wife and parents alike wanted a description of the Army Badge. Evidently Davis hadn't informed his relatives of his latest honor. The Press received the information through Army Public Relations.

The badge, it was revealed, is a symbol of the front line fighting man. It distinguishes the combat soldier from rear area and service troops. It consists of a miniature replica of a Revolutionary War Flintlock rifle mounted on a blue background and superimposed on a wreath.
