 mission should logically be included in the study.  
 Spelman protested that the committee would be too crowded and that the city could better afford to send three, not four, representatives to the state legislature in Sacramento to present the findings of the committee.  
 A similar effort and trip was made only recently by Mayor Haggard and city manager George Stevens without success. Spelman further suggested that, in as much as Redondo Beach has a similar problem on 101 highway, that city be in-

vited to join the investigation. ALREADY TRIED  
 It was brought out by Commander Wm. Mason of Hollywood Riviera, that Redondo Beach has already gained the cooperation of the State Highway Department, and that eight traffic signals will be installed along Pacific Coast Highway in that city in the near future, a fact unknown to some members of the city council.  
 Other council business included a recommendation by Drale that a barricade be placed across 374th street during rainy weather. This he said might induce the state to repair the road, a state

highway, which is hazardous when wet.  
 At this point there was an interruption from the floor. A member of the audience jumped up and asked what would happen if he ran into the barricade.  
 The question was out of order, but the mayor did not call the speaker into line.  
 There was no action on Drale's motion, and it died for lack of a second.  
 A recommendation was made by Drale to commend Paul Roetger of the Recreation Department for his motion to take action on clearing Torrance beach.
