A new vacuum milk-producing unit, first of its kind in California, has been installed at the creamery.

Melville said the unit will remove air from the milk and according to scientists, will help the milk retain its vitamin C.

The unit was approved by Dr. F. P. Wilcox, county health officer, and Elmo Moen, county district dairy inspector, he said.

The second modern convenience for milk buyers is the "Two Toter." A clever plastic handle that securely anchors two quart cartons together, the invention

makes it possible for housewives to have quart convenience at half-gallon price.

Displaying the new device, Melville secured two quart cartons of Mayfair milk in the handle and whirled them over his head to prove the safety of the "Two Toter."
