

Citizens Fight Appointment City Planner

Heated protests were heard from residents of Waverly and Pacific Hills when the Planning Commission submitted a recommendation to the City Council last Tuesday that Leo Di Mayle of 200 Paseo de Gracia, Hollywood Riviera, be appointed to fill a vacancy on the planning body.

Residents of the sister communities in Southwest Torrance expressed the view that their area should be represented on the commission, and claimed that promises of such an appointment had been made by past City Councils.

The name of Jesse Minter, a Pacific Hills civic leader and professional planning engineer, was suggested for the vacancy, which has existed for over six months.

The Council approved the Planning Commission recommendation. However, the appointment

must be ratified by Mayor Marvin Schwab, who deferred a decision until further study had been made.
