"Peak demand" tells how much capacity we need!

"Generating capacity" isn't like warehouse capacity, where products can be stored and withdrawn as the need arises. Electricity can't be stored, so our capacity must be enough to make all the electricity that might be needed on our lines at any given moment. We keep records on that "peak demand" moment each year. In 1951 it was on October 24th—1,559,500 kilowatts. Over the past five years, each "peak" has been higher than the year before, by an average of 95,000 kilowatts.
