Other Council business included: approval by Mayor Schwab of the Planning Commission recommendation of Leo Di Mayle of Hollywood Riviera to fill the vacancy on the Commission; Council decision to commence work immediately on a sanitary sewer district for SSeaside Ranches; appropriation of \$4,600 from the capital outlay fund of the Recreation Dept. for various improvements to park property; appropriation of \$590.76 for city maps; Council decision to retain Don Armstrong to represent the city in its suit against the operators of Torrance Sand and Gravel Company; and a Council directive to Police John Stroh to issue a permit to the Hollywood Riviera Sportsmen Club for a fire works stand that group plans to operate.

Local Couple Die in Auto, Truck Crash

A head-on collision with a truck last week snuffed out the lives of a Torrance couple who were vacationing in Oregon, according to a recent report from that state. Killed instantly in the accident which occurred near Medford were Dudley C. Fullington, 43, and his wife, Katherine, 39, both of 3128 W. 186th St. Dispatches from Medford indicated their car was smashed almost head-on by an unloaded truck and trailer driven by Roy Lee H. Newson of Medford. Newson, who was not held, said his carrier veered out of control on the rain-slick pavement and crashed against the Fullington car. Fullington was crushed behind the steering wheel and his spouse was hurled to the pavement, it was indicated.

Candidates Share Heavy Votes Here

Total votes for Torrance area precincts for candidates in the June primary election show that this area normally two to one Democratic, is sharing the Republican point of view. The highest offices voted upon, that of United States Senator, found Senator Knowland carrying both tickets, as he did throughout California, to win reelection. On the Democratic ballot, the votes were: Knowland, 2759; Watwood, 472; McKinnon, 1901 in Torrance only. In the area, including Lomita, Rolling Hills, the Shoestring strip and Keystone, Knowland won 4586 Democratic votes; McKinnon 3244; Watwood 820. On the Republican ballot, Knowland won 2723 votes, McKinnon 209 and Adams 122, in Torrance only. From the entire area, Knowland won 4445 votes, McKinnon 347 and Adams 237. On the election of delegates to the Democratic National Convention, the Kefauver slated polled 3423 votes in Torrance to Brown's 1407. For the Torrance area including Lomita and other communities, mentioned in Kefauver's slate won 6011 votes to Brown's 2365. On the Republican National Convention delegation ballot, Torrance went for the Governor Warren ticket giving Warren 2250 votes to Werdel's 1033. District-wide, the vote was 3559 for Warren and 1557 for Werdel. Supervisor Ray Darby carried Torrance and area with a 3 to 1 majority over his nearest op-

(Continued from Page One) in the Montebello School District. Dr. Hull's original salary was \$10,000 per year. A tentative budget of \$2,106,778 for the 1952-53 fiscal year was submitted to the Board of Education at last Tuesday's meeting of that body, by Emmett Ingram, schools business manager. The tentative budget representing an increase of more than \$200,000 over the \$1,858,420 budget adopted for the current fiscal year and is based on Ingram's estimate of a 10 per cent increase in the district's assessed valuation. NO TAX INCREASE This will not increase the current operating expense tax of \$1.69, Dr. J. H. Hull, Superintendent of Schools, said. But local tax bills will be higher this year because of the \$3 mil-


lion bond issue passed by the voters last February. The board is slated to tentatively adopt the budget at its meeting on June 17. Any necessary revisions are to be made in time for the public hearing and final adoption in early August. The board Tuesday night purchased a site near Walteria for future development of another elementary school. An 8.6 acre tract, lying east of the planned extension of Crenshaw Blvd. and south of Pacific Coast Hwy., was procured for \$27,800, \$3200 per acre. The property is part of the former Weston Ranch and reportedly will be subdivided in the near future. The board approved the name of the Evelyn Carr School for a new elementary school to be built in North Torrance. The new plant was originally named the Alondra School, however, a citizen's committee from that area requested that the

board consider a name which did not include an area outside of Torrance. Evelyn Carr was a member of the first Torrance Board of Education.
