Begin Work on New Lomita Tract
 Work on a \$1,000,000 addition of 117 homes to Harbor Village at Lomita Blvd. and Western Ave. will begin this week, according to officials of the G & G Construction Company of Manhattan Beach, builders of the tract.
 The 24 1/2-acre site was purchased from Harry Brittain, Inc., of Long Beach the firm which has built the 157 homes already located in the subdivision on a 37-acre site, it was reported.
 Grading on the project has started, with actual construction due to begin sometime next week, according to Paul Griffin, a partner in the G & G Construction Company.
 Site of the new homes is adjacent to the 40-acre campus of the proposed Narbonne High School, which will be built with funds allocated in the recent bond issue.
 Streets in the tract are Western Ave. on the west, Lomita Blvd. on the south, President Ave. on the east, and 246th St. on the north.
 President Ave. presently terminated at Lomita Blvd. but it will be extended through the tract as work progresses, Griffin said.
