

## Bob Finch Addresses Lions Club

Robert H. Finch, Inglewood attorney and 17th District Congressional candidate, addressed the Torrance Lions Club at its regular weekly meeting Tuesday at the Ding How Cafe. "The Citizen in the Political Arena" was the subject of Finch's non-political talk, the feature of the meeting. Finch was introduced by Warren Hamilton, program chairman, of the club. Pointing out that politics is everybody's business, Finch traced the responsibility for despotic governments directly to indifference by their citizens. He urged all club members to take an active part in community and national politics regardless of personal political affiliation. "Only by having the citizen actively working for what he believes is right can America retain the high ideals that has made us the leader of the free world," he said. ## NEW CITY BUS LINE APPROVED

A municipal bus line to run through North Torrance was this week authorized by the Board of Public Utilities and Transportation, it was announced by Marshall Chamberlain, superintendent of the Torrance Municipal Bus Lines. The new route will probably begin operations on October 13, Chamberlain said. He anticipated that the line would pay for itself, or come very close to it. Currently there is only one Torrance bus line, the Torrance to Los Angeles line, that consistently pays its own way. The new line will run up Torrance Blvd. to Hawthorne, then up to 174th St. It will proceed then to Crenshaw Blvd. and up to El Segundo Blvd. Stops will be made along Laconia and Hoover, and from there will proceed along the regular route to Olympic Blvd. and Hill St. in Los Angeles. No changes in the present Torrance to Los Angeles line is slated, according to Chamberlain.
