Armed Youth Arrested in Stolen Auto

The alertness of an Avalon Village woman who spotted her stolen car was credited with the arrest last Saturday of a youth who carried a stolen pistol he said he planned to use to rob a liquor store.

The 16-year-old Long Beach youth was apprehended in Wilmington after making a desperate attempt to escape by ramming a police car that blocked his way.

Officers Jerry Gannon Jr. and B. W. Embree said the lad was pointed out to them by Mrs. Coralee Like, 28, of 23508 Ravenna Ave., who with Alvin DeJaynes, 27, of 23512 Ravenna Ave., was seeking the car stolen from her home Friday night.

After spotting her car, they hailed the police officers who cornered the driver on a dirt roadway by Avalon Blvd. south of Sepulveda Blvd. Seeing his exit was barred, the youth rammed the car into the police vehicle, police said.

Police found in the car a foreign-made pistol which they said had been stolen from a sporting goods store. The youth admitted he planned to use the gun to rob a liquor store and said, "I was going to kill anyone who got in my way."

Investigators said the lad is an escapee from a sheriff's boys camp where he was committed for an armed robbery in Long Beach and also is wanted for an auto theft in Compton.

Historical Gavel Given to Realty Board

Recognition of the services of local realtors in World War II, was made Friday night when C. J. "Paddy" Ryan told a gathering of the members of the Torrance-Lomita Realty Board that the National Association of Realty Boards had given him, on behalf of the local group, an inscribed gavel.

Ryan, president of the realty board, disclosed that the gavel was presented to him at a recent dinner meeting of the 21st District of the California Real Estate Association, held on Sept. 17.

The gavel, and its velvet-lined box, are made of wood from the Mr. Vernon home of George Washington and the Monticello home of Thomas Jefferson. A metal band on the gavel and a decorative plaque on the box came from the quarterdeck of the battleship U.S.S. Missouri, aboard which the Japanese agreement of surrender was signed by General Douglas MacArthur and Fleet Admiral Chester Nimitz on Sept. 2, 1945.

The new gavel will be used by the president of the realty board at meetings.
