
Arts and Crafts Nite Classes Offered In Adult Education

Extensive Study Of Entire Student Body at El Camino

Preparations were under way this week at El Camino College for making an extensive study of the entire student body, Dr. William H. Harless, director of instruction, said today. The study began yesterday, according to present plans. "We have planned this study in order to find out some extremely important information concerning our students which we cannot get in any other way," Dr. Harless said. He added, "We need this information so that we can plan the future offerings of the college and keep them in line with the needs of the students and the community." The use of an electrical tabulating machine, an IBM machine, is planned according to Dr. Harless. A seven-page questionnaire will be distributed to students which obtain information concerning the background of students, their future objectives, the courses they are now taking, outside employment, place of residence, and preferred major fields. The information from the questionnaire will be transferred to IBM cards which will be sorted
