TEAC Method Of Electing Officers Hit

Dr. Howard Wood this week was named to serve as moderator of the Torrance Educational Advisory Committee in an election that brought strong criticism of the election methods used.

Since the inception of TEAC more than five years ago the annual election of the three officers has been made by direct nomination and a vote of the membership.

Rules Changed
This year, however, abruptly modified governing rules of the organization called for the appointment of a nominating committee.

Mrs. Grace Wright, who has served as moderator for five consecutive terms, named four women, all prominent in school and civic activities, to serve as a nominating committee. Chairmanned by Mrs. Ruth Kasten, president of the high school P-TA, the nominating body included Mrs. Dorothy Johnson, Seaside Home Owners group, Mrs. M. M. Tappin, Torrance elementary P-TA, and Mrs. Ruth Brooks, North Torrance Civic Improvement Association.

Vote Called
At Monday's meeting, Mrs. Kasten, as chairman, addressed the assembly, nominating only one person for each of the three offices. The nominations were promptly seconded, and the vote called.

After adjournment, several persons were heard to remark that the whole thing was staged so rapidly and so smoothly that they didn't even know what had happened.

Two other offices of TEAC have been filled by Mrs. A. C. Turner, who was named alternate moderator, and Dale Isenberg, who will serve as secretary-treasurer.


