

"Dick" Felker, chairman of Torrance Branch, American National Red Cross announced this week that the nation's newest Red Cross headquarters at King City, Calif., had started operation with a bang on Oct. 18, when a bloodmobile operation at nearby Soledad State Prison set a new record for blood donated in one day.

Santa Clara Valley Regional Blood Center in operation in the prison, 1,167 pints were collected to top the national record of 1,131 pints donated in one day by the aircraft carrier USS Philippine Sea.

The enthusiasm of the prisoners was pointed up by the fact that donors represented 66% of the prison's population of 1,777. Warden Bert O. Webb has challenged other prisons of the nation to beat Soledad's percentage record and offers \$100 out of his own pocket to the prison that tops it. Nine prisons across the nation have accepted the challenge.

Although Torrance cannot possibly "top" that kind of record we can put our support behind the January blood bank now by volunteering to donate a pint of blood.
