Merchants Aid Drive for Big Electric Sign

A number of prominent Torrance merchants have pledged their support to the drive to acquire a large neon sign directing Western Ave. traffic to the downtown business district, according to Dale Isenberg, executive secretary of the Torrance Chamber of Commerce and organizer of the project.

On display now at the Chamber is an artist's drawing of the proposed sign, to be purchased from the Gillespie Neon Co., of Gardena. Cost Told

The two-faced sign will be nine feet high and 18 feet wide and will be erected high over the street at the intersection of Torrance Blvd. and Western ave. The cost of the sign has been set at \$1800, according to Isenberg.

It will bear the legend "Torrance—City of Industrial Opportunity." Below this will be a large neon arrow pointing to the business section and bearing the words "Business District."
