

Your beauty plan with FRAN

"Your Beauty Plan"—std. hed. Abe Burroughs, the witty, incorrigible playwright and songwriter, once wrote a comic song entitled, "The Girl With the Not One, Not Two, But Three Blue Eyes". It was typical Burroughs fun, but it illustrated in a comic way the inspiration given to songs, stories and plays by the beauty of women's eyes.

One woman once bitterly complained to me, "Let's face it, there's nothing you can do with your eyes. You can't dye them, enlarge them or set them wider apart. You're simply stuck with them and that is all."

My answer was, "That is certainly NOT all. There is a great deal one can do."

Your eyes can be the most alluring feature you have if properly emphasized. This matter of emphasis depends upon good taste and a sense of artistic balance.

If nature has already endowed you with big, beautiful eyes, then you are indeed fortunate. In that case, emphasize them subtly.

First of all, eye cream is an important "must" for the delicate eye area. It should be gently finger-printed about the eyes as this area is sensitive and easily irritated by harsh massage. When eye cream is applied at night, it is applied over the entire eye area and allowed to remain overnight. When used during the day, it should be used only over the upper lids.

This treatment provides protection, helps keep lids smooth and lustrous and make-up will appear fresh and complete.

Because there are few oil-glands around the eye with little or no lubrication supplied by nature, eye-cream is equally needed by young and old alike.

Eyebrows provide a frame for the eyes and should be carefully shaped. Avoid thick, bushy eyebrows. If you are dark-complexioned, Eyebrows should be plucked with tweezers that have been dipped in alcohol. They should be tweezed from underneath and should follow the natural shape of the brow line.

Avoid over-thinning. A tiny artificial, pencil-line is apt to give you a fixed look of perpetual surprise, which is far more bizarre than it is flattering. Use the pencil sparingly—don't bear down heavily. As most of us have neither all black nor all brown hair, a more natural look is acquired by the use of a dark brown pencil.

There is an art in applying eye shadow. When one has protruding eyes, it is well to avoid its use entirely. With sunken eyes, shadow may be used to emphasize the length of the lashes and the eye-brow line.

Use eye shadow sparingly. Apply it just over the lashes and with the little finger extend it up over the lid, until it fades out entirely. If eyes are closely set, use eye shadow more intensely on outer lids. If eyes are widely spaced, concentrate the eye shadow in the inner corners. The color of the eyes, costume and time of day determine the shade to be used.
