# \$25,000 REWARD FOR DYNAMITERS!

Southern California Edison Company offers to pay a reward of \$25,000 for information leading to the arrest and conviction of the person or persons who dynamited the company's 220,000 volt transmission towers on Monday night, March 23, and Tuesday morning, March 24.

The two transmission towers which were dynamited Monday night, March 23, at 9:13 1/2 and 9:14 1/2 p.m., are located on the company's Chino-Pisgah 220,000 volt transmission lines (Mile 229, Tower #1) approximately four miles east of the town of Chino. These lines carry electric energy to the Edison system from Hoover Dam.

The towers dynamited Tuesday morning, March 24, at 7:36 a.m. are located on the company's Magunden-Saugus 220,000 volt transmission lines (Mile 183, Tower #1) approximately twenty-seven miles north of Saugus and three miles east of Gorman. The Edison Magunden-Saugus transmission lines carry electric energy from the company's Big Creek generating plants in the High Sierra.

Mrs. Gertrude Carpenter, 36-year-old Lomita housewife, nosed out nearly 600 other contestants in the cake baking contest staged at the National Orange Festival in Riverside last Tuesday, when she topped third prize in a competition that ranks among the best.

For her efforts Mrs. Carpenter, who resides with her husband Floyd and daughters Elythe, 5, and Joanne, 4, at 2340 W. 255th st., Lomita, was awarded a 16-piece set of Farberware pots and pans and a lovely corsage.

Of 600 original contestants, 60 were selected as finalists. This group returned to the festival, and before the eyes of the judges whipped together their cakes, and served them up still warm. Mrs. Carpenter relates that she trembled when judges cut a slice from her "Orange Torte" and tasted it. She added that she kept right on trembling when they announced the winners, and she found herself acclaimed as third place winner.

The recipe for Mrs. Carpenter's fabulous cake has been in the family for years, and was given to her by an aunt in Wisconsin. It has never been in a cook book, but it will now, says the prize-winning cook.

Mrs. Carpenter attributes much of her cooking skill to the fact that she was raised on a farm back in Wisconsin where she "learned quite a bit about cooking and raising a family."

## Slate Easter Sunrise Services


